

Dear Permian Parents & Students,

Permian High School has developed a campus wide set of grading guidelines to ensure equity in all our classes. The purpose of these guidelines is to maintain consistency on how much weight assignments are given from class to class concerning: tests, quizzes, essays, journals, lab assignments, daily work, homework, student participation, and/or any assignment a teacher gives that is recorded as a grade in their gradebook.

Inside this pamphlet are descriptions of two grading plans. The first grading plan will be for all Regular weighted classes. The second grading plan will be for all Advanced weighted classes - Pre-AP, AP, Honors, and GT.

Dual Credit classes are also Advanced weighted classes. However, these classes will not be required to follow the high school grading guidelines. The reason is that Dual Credit classes are taught by college professors who are governed by our local colleges. These college professors work in conjunction with ECISD, but they have the freedom to grade as they choose as long as they follow their own college policies and procedures.

Please read this pamphlet carefully. **If you have questions about any of your child's grades during the school year, we encourage you to contact your child's teacher as soon as possible.**

Our goal is to give your child the best high school education in Texas and one that is fair and consistent from class to class.

We look forward to another successful school year as we prepare your child for graduation, for college, and/or the career of their choosing.

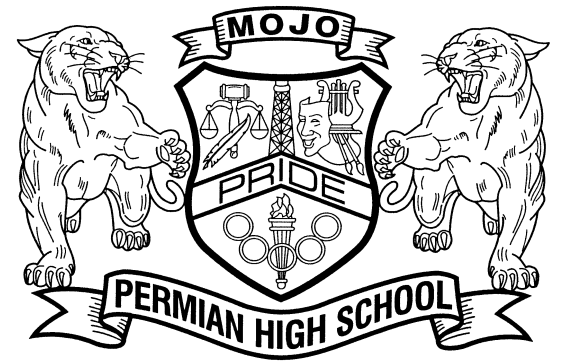

ECISD SCHOOL BOARD POLICY

EIA Regulation – Academic Achievement Grading: “A minimum of six grades per six weeks grading period shall be recorded in grade books used in computing grades.”

Most Permian teachers record many more grades than the district minimum every six weeks. It is important for parents to monitor their child’s grades weekly.

Parents are strongly encouraged to sign up for Parent Portal to review their child’s grades online. Please see your child’s Den Registrar to receive your pass code to sign up for Parent Portal.

SEMESTER AVERAGES

For any specific semester, the three six-weeks averages will count $\frac{3}{4}$ or 75% and the final examination $\frac{1}{4}$ or 25% of the semester grade.

Example:

1 st 6 Weeks Average	90
2 nd 6 Weeks Average	80
3 rd 6 Weeks Average	95
Final Exam Grade	+95

360 divided by 4
= **90 Semester Average**

REGULAR CLASSES

Each 6 weeks grading period, teachers will record a minimum of 6 instructional grades and 2 planner grades. Instructional grades will be divided into Major and Minor categories.

Major Grades **50%**

(tests, essays, projects, presentations, major labs, etc...) Teachers must have a minimum of 2 grades in this category every 6 weeks.

Minor Grades **45%**

(quizzes, labs, homework, daily work, student participation, journals, notebook checks, etc...) Teachers must have a minimum of 4 grades in this category every 6 weeks.

Student Planner Grades **5%**

Teachers will take 2 planner grades every 6 weeks period. Replacement Planners are \$7 each.

Late Work - 15 pts. per School Day, after 3 days, it’s a zero and will not be accepted

Re-Do Failed Assignments Students can re-do an attempted failed assignment for a maximum grade of 75 on the 2nd attempt

Teachers have the authority in deciding which instructional assignments are Major grades or Minor grades. Teachers may also choose to offer an instructional assignment as extra credit, or offer test corrections, but are not required to do so.



ADVANCED CLASSES

(Pre-AP, AP, Honors, GT)

Each 6 weeks grading period, teachers will record a minimum of 6 instructional grades and 2 planner grades. Instructional grades will be divided into Major and Minor categories.

Major Grades **60%**

(tests, essays, projects, presentations, major labs, etc...) Teachers must have a minimum of 2 grades in this category every 6 weeks.

Minor Grades **35%**

(quizzes, labs, homework, daily work, student participation, journals, notebook checks, etc...) Teachers must have a minimum of 4 grades in this category every 6 weeks.

Student Planner Grades **5%**

Teachers will take 2 planner grades every 6 weeks period. Replacement Planners are \$7 each.

Late Work - 25 pts. per School Day, after 2 days, it’s a zero and will not be accepted

Re-Do Failed Assignments Students can re-do an attempted failed assignment for a maximum grade of 75 on the 2nd attempt

Teachers have the authority in deciding which instructional assignments are Major grades or Minor grades. Teachers may also choose to offer an instructional assignment as extra credit, or offer test corrections, but are not required to do so.
