Permian High School has the largest Dual Credit Program in West Texas. Each year, Permian students have earned collectively over 4,000 semester college hours. Many of our students begin college full time after our graduation as a college sophomore due to our Dual Credit Program.

Permian has a large Pre-AP and AP course selection for students to choose in the areas of English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language, Art, and Music. Students earn college credit by scoring a 3, 4, or 5 on these nationally recognized Advanced Placement (AP) tests.

Permian students have been offered over 3 million in college scholarship dollars annually. While many of our students stay and attend our own local and prestigious colleges of OC and UTPB, Permian also has students attending Texas Tech University, Texas A&M University, the University of Texas in Austin, Baylor University, Texas Christian University, West Texas A&M in Canyon, Abilene Christian University, the University of Oklahoma, and a few as far away as Brigham Young University and Harvard University.

Academic Rigor – All classes are offered as Regular Academic Classes. Students may choose classes that offer additional rigor and a higher weighted GPA through our Pre-AP Classes, Honor Classes, AP Classes, and Dual Credit Classes. Some Dual Credit Classes may be taken online. Students may qualify for Special Education services, English as a Second Language (ESL) services, the New Comers Academy within ESL, and 504 services to assist them with their academic needs.

Graduation Plans

The Class of 2015, 2016, & 2017 are on the Recommended or Distinguished Graduation Plan that includes 26 credits to graduate. The Class of 2018 will be on the new state graduation plan called the Foundation Plan with endorsements in Public Services, Arts & Humanities, Business, Multidisciplinary, or STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math), that includes 26 credits to graduate. Students in the Classes of 2015, 2016, 2017 can choose to move to the Foundation Graduation Plan.

MOJO School Spirit

In addition to the many school organizations and athletic teams, our students show their MOJO pride while attending many of our school pep rallies, theme days, the Homecoming Dance and Bonfire, sporting events, Prom, music concerts, academic competitions, Senior Fun Day, athletic and academic awards banquets, and Graduation. We encourage ALL our students to get involved in one or more of our many student activities and become part of our MOJO family.

Campus Renovations

Permian High School will have over \$32 million in construction during the 2014-2015 school year to build new Tennis Courts, a new Band Hall, a new 2 story Academic Wing, additional Locker Rooms, PE Gym, Choir Room, Administrative Offices, expanded Cafeteria & Food Court, and a renovated Auditorium. The renovations are to be completed in order for the 9th graders be moved to the Permian campus for the 2015-2016 school year.
