Expected Achievement Levels on Academic Assessments	Students in 3 rd -5 th grades complete the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness, or STAAR test. The STAAR test measures student achievement in grades 3 rd -5 th and measures student progress in reading and math for 4 th and 5 th grades. Bilingual students in K-5 th grades are also evaluated in their language proficiency through the Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS). In addition, every teacher in K-5 th grades administers the district's Short Cycle formative assessments at the end of each unit. These tests are geared toward the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS).
